

Grant originated in the 87th Texas Legislature

- \$70 million was appropriated for the original grant, with \$35 million for each of 2022-2023 and 2023-2024.
- Approximately \$8 million is still available for local education agencies (LEAs).





Who is eligible to apply?

- All Texas public schools and open-enrollment charter schools are eligible to apply for grant funding.
- Current recipients of the two year 2022-2024
 Innovative Services for Students with Autism
 Grant are not eligible to apply.
- LEAs may apply individually or in collaboration with other districts or open-enrollment charter schools. Prioritization of funding is given to collaborative applications.





Purpose of the Grant



To increase the LEA's capacity to implement innovative programs that effectively serve students with autism ages three through 21.



To result in effective, scalable models that can be replicated in other areas of the state.

To be eligible for a grant award, the LEA's application must incorporate:

- Evidence-based practices
- Data collection on student achievement and improvement
- Parental support and collaboration
- Use of technology, which may include interactive technology
- Meaningful inclusion
- Ability to replicate the program for students statewide







General list of allowable expenses for grant include but not limited to:

Salaries for dedicated staff

Professional or contracted services

Capital outlay and equipment

Instructional resources, curriculum development, and materials

Technology

Interpreter or translation for services for parent training

March & April 2023


- If funds are available after all eligible applications are reviewed, LEAs may resubmit applications that need revision in order to be eligible for funding.

- The LEA will be notified during the review process that resubmission is an option.





